

Research Presentation

These presentations will be your summative assessments and will make up a big part of your grade. More importantly it will allow the rest of the class to clearly understand your research and ask questions and give you valuable feedback that could further, and strengthen your research. It is also something that is becoming more and more common in undergraduate work and is a staple of graduate level work.

Layout of presentation

Your presentation must be well organized and easy for the class to follow. It must flow and allow people to see your work and understand how it relates to your work. Although every research project is different here is the basic structure of the presentation and must present in your presentation. Each section should be a slide.

- Title Slide
- Introduction
- Background / literature review
- Research Question(s)
- Research Methods
- Findings/ Data
- Discussion/ Conclusion(s)
- Future Research
- References
- Acknowledgments
- Questions
